

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Saturday 15th July is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In Australia, this is normally a Holy Day of Obligation, which means that all Catholics are obliged to attend mass; However this year, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, the Bishops of Australia, in accordance to Cannon Law, have dispensed all Catholics from this Obligation which means that you don't have to attend mass if you don't want to.



Those wishing to attend Mass, the following masses will be offered at St Oliver Plunket's: Friday, 14th August, 6pm / Saturday, 15th August, 8am and 10am.

The numbers will be limited to 50 persons (including children) at each mass and all other usual Covid-19 procurations regarding name taking and sanitising will apply.

I thank him for his continued trust in me. To help me better minister with you into the future I have also asked and he has consented that a review of my priestly ministry with you over the last six years be conducted. To that end two members of the Diocesan Personnel Board; Mrs. Paula Kerr and Mons. Ron McFarlane will conduct the review. I thank them for accepting this task. However as we continue to live through a global pandemic and we are all vulnerable people, and also to allow as many who wish to participate in this process to do so, the following email address is been made available. Any and every person who may wish to make a comment to the reviewers please use this email address. The email can only be accessed by the reviewers and by no one else, including myself. Thus providing complete confidentiality and anonymity if you wish. The reviewers will collate and summarise your comments and feed them back to me at the end of the process. To help you in your reflections but not limit you in your comments, you may find the fol-lowing questions helpful:

In what ways has Fr Chris's ministry at St Oliver's helped or hindered your faith/prayer life. Is there more he should be doing, and/or is there some things he should stop doing.
In what way has Fr Chris's administration of St Oliver's Parish helped /hindered the welfare of the parish. Is there more he should be doing, and/or is there some things he should stop doing.

All your responses will be taken seriously by the reviewers and by me. I encourage you to be as honest as you can. I want to listen to you so I can better minister with you. Thanking you in advance for your engagement in this process.

THIS WEEK'S SAINTS AND FEAST DAYS:

Sunday, 2ndAugust - SAINT PETER JULIAN EYMARD (1811 - 1868) The patron saint of eucharistic devotion. He founded the Congregation of the Priests of the Most Blessed Sacrament and the Servants of the Blessed Sacra-

He founded the Congregation of the Priests of the Most Blessed Sacrament and the Servants of the Blessed Sacra-ment, an order of sisters, both devoted to perpetual adoration. He was canonized in 1962. **Tuesday**, 4thAugust - SAINT JOHN VIANNEY(1786-1859) Born near Lyon, France, became a model parish priest, was devoted to his parishioners and became famous forrigorous preaching and insights in the confessional. The Cure of Ars, as he was known, spent up to 18hours aday hearing the confessions of pilgrims who sought him out. He is the patron of parish priests. **Saturday**, 8thAugust - SAINT DOMINIC (1170-1221) Dominic was head of a preaching mission that evolved into the Or-der of Preachers, or Dominicans. A friar said that he had "a lively sympathy with any suffering." **Saturday**, 8thAugust - SAINT MARY HELEN MACKILLOP (1842 - 1909) Mother MacKillop is Australia's first native-born saint and its patron. The oldest of eight children of Scottish immigrants, Mary began working with children as a governess. Mary founded the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart, the continent's first religious order, to open schools and orphanages for poor children in rural areas and to serve the aged and friendless by setting up women's shel-ters. She took the name **Mary of the Cross**, and survived episcopal opposition, disrespect and even excom-munication. The order received papal approval in 1888, and her 2010 canonization in Rome drew thousands of pilgrims from Australia, where she is considered a national heroine.
