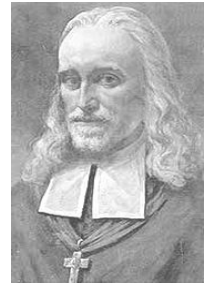

### **PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT**

The Parish's financial situation is currently healthy, although we expect it will worsen as the impact of COVID-19 continues.

We recorded a small deficit of \$1,001 for the 12 months to 30 June 2020. A large reduction in collections and other income (due to COVID-19) was largely offset by the government's JobKeeper subsidy. However, the next 12 months will be much more difficult as the COVID-19 situation is expected to extend beyond Christmas and JobKeeper will be phased out. Wages, insurance and parish maintenance remain our main expenses.

Thank you very much for your generous support each year. Our parishioners are among the most giving in the diocese when it comes to mission appeals and designated collections, with nearly \$14,000 raised in the last financial year. Thank you again for your generosity and we look forward to your continued support..

### **COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) UPDATE: NEW WEDDING GUIDELINES**

From September 14, new Government regulations were introduced that affect all weddings, and Church properties.

Up to 150 people are now allowed to attend a wedding service at a place of public worship. This number was previously limited to 100 people.

Social distancing and the 4 square metre per person requirements are still in place.
